Morning Grain Comments

Opening Trend: Steady

Reason: Soybeans were finally unable to hold on to support and are on the low side again early this morning. Corn and wheat have traded in a very narrow range the entire week.

The Factors:

Bullish:

 Severe storms and heavy rains in the forecast for this weekend across Missouri and Illinois. Corn bulls still trying to point to more and more weather issues as a reason for corn to run higher. We get our first look at crop conditions on Tuesday, which will start to tell the story.

Bearish:

- Soybean new crop export sales to date are running at the lowest level in 9 years. Technical support in beans also fell by the wayside yesterday as the market fell another 9 cents. With a record amount of acres being planted, and sales being so slow, a massive surplus is probably in the works.
- Early harvested wheat in Oklahoma is showing signs of better than expected yield numbers.
- Crude oil was set to make another impressive move higher yesterday after more production cuts were announced, but fell completely flat and commodities posted a rough day across the board.
